Course Content

Social Pedagogy Leadership – not only an introduction to key aspects of social pedagogy, you will learn about ethical practice, the Human Learning Systems approach and relationship-centred practice. You will explore how you can affect positive change by applying these and other relevant theories.

Effective Communication – a key skill in effective leadership, in this module you will learn about how to use communication to develop compassionate and effective relationships and leadership. There is also a focus on organisational communication and change.

Critical Reflection – this module will help you understand the importance of developing critical reflection in practice. Linked to the social pedagogical principles of learning and growth in direct practice as well as team and organisational change.

Legal and Ethical Literacy – focusing on an analytical understanding of the law you will learn how legislation and policy can be used to promote positive change and ethical practice.

The course is taught using a blended learning approach with modules taught on-line, see website or contact the Course Leader for more details on course content.
